



WMN+ Summer Grantwriting Infosession

April 14, 2023





Program Goals

The goal of this Grantwriting Incubator Workshop is to prepare graduate students, junior faculty, new faculty (since 2019) to the UofM, and new principal investigators (PIs) from any department to submit a funding proposal (either internal to the UofM, or external). By the end of the 10 week workshop, participants will have a complete (or near-complete) proposal to submit.





Partnership

Participants will work collaboratively with a partner of their choosing who will provide content area expertise, mentorship, and feedback throughout the 10 weeks. The partnership contract will be for the duration of the 10 weeks, and the partner may or may not ultimately be listed on the final grant submission. The PI and partner will identify their goals and deliverables and define the scope of the partnership (limited to, or going beyond the workshop).





Deliverables

Participants will submit components of their grant throughout the course of the 10 week program via the Canvas platform, and give a final presentation to the other participants during Class 10.





Frequently Asked Questions

Who can apply for the workshop?

Faculty and students and the UofM. We are prioritizing newly hired faculty (since 2019), faculty who are new to grantwriting, and graduate students.

How long is the workshop?

The workshop is ten weeks (May 30 through August 9). We will meet weekly on Wednesdays from 10:00-11:30am via Zoom.

How will the course be administered?

Participants will use Canvas for discussion and submitting deliverables for the workshop.

What is a Pre-Award Coordinator?

A Pre-Award Coordinator is a specialist in helping faculty (and students) through the early stages of writing grants. This can include help with identifying grants, formulating budgets, routing the grant proposal through proper University channels, and preparing other documents required for submission.

How do I identify my partner for this 10 week program?

The Women+'s Mentorship Network, and the College of Arts and Sciences in collaboration with the Herff College of Engineering have "expertise databases" where you can search for partners with expertise in your area, or who are interested in serving as mentors. Your Pre-Award Coordinator will also be able to help you identify a potential partner that will be a good fit for your project.





Frequently Asked Questions

Does my partner have to be in the same college, school, department, or unit as me? Not at all!

Is the partner required to be listed on the final grant proposal submitted by the PI? This is an arrangement that will need to be determined by the PI and the partner.

I am concerned about protecting my intellectual property and ideas. Will I be required to share the entirety of my grant proposal?

You will not be required to share the entirety of your grant proposal with anyone but the course administrators (Leigh Harrell-Williams, Crystal White, and Leah Windsor). You will share a research summary and contribute to the discussion board on topics and questions related to the grantwriting process, but all intellectual property will remain yours.

To whom will I be presenting in Week 10 and what will that consist of?

Participants will share their message box, proposal submission timeline, and a summary of lessons learned with the other participants in the course. Other members of the University research community (Division of Research and Innovation; Office of Sponsored Projects; etc.) will be invited to attend the final presentations and provide feedback.
