GUEST CONDUCTOR BIOGRAPHY

Jordan Langworthy is the Director of Choral Music at Germantown High School in Madison, Mississippi. She graduated from Mississippi College in 2012 with a Bachelor's degree in Music Education and earned her Master's degree in Secondary Education from William Carey University in 2017.

Jordan is an experienced clinician, having worked with various honor choirs, including the Gulf Coast's 4th Grade Music in Our Schools Festival, the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) Children's Honor Choir on Mississippi's Gulf Coast, Vicksburg's Elementary Honor Choir, Hinds County Honor Choir, Mississippi's District 2's Honor Choir, Mississippi's District 5 and 8's Summer Choir Camp, Mississippi's All-State Showchoir, and multiple ensembles in the metro area. She has also adjudicated for Alabama's State Choral Performance Association Assessment and several solo and ensemble festivals across Mississippi.

In addition to her work as a clinician and adjudicator, Jordan serves as the President for the high school division for MMEA (Mississippi Music Educator's Association). She is an active member of both the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) and the American Choral Director's Association (ACDA). She has presented sessions at the Mississippi All-State Choral Conference and the Mississippi Music Educators Association Fall Workshop, and her students performed at the 2023 ACDA/MMEA joint conference and were recently chosen to perform at the 2025 ACDA/MMEA joint conference. She also is conducting a concert on the stage of Lincoln Center through Distinguished Concerts International New York in March of 2026.

Jordan is a proud National Board Certified Teacher and has held leadership roles within the Mississippi Music Educators Association, including district chair for the choral division and President of the High School Division for both the Mississippi High School Activities Association (MHSAA) and the Mississippi Music Educators Association. In 2023, she was honored as Germantown High School's Teacher of the Year and Madison County School District's High School Teacher of the Year. She has recently been recognized as Mississippi College's Distinguished Young Alumna for the Department of Music as well as been awarded the NFHS's Heart of the Arts Award for the state of Mississippi.

Dedicated to inspiring and enriching the lives of her students, Jordan is committed to preparing them to be not only productive and accomplished adults but also to thrive in their personal and professional lives.

FACULTY CONDUCTOR BIOGRAPHY

Francis Cathlina, D.M.A. (he/him) is a Vietnamese-American conductor and educator, renowned for his innovative approach to choral music. His concerts invite audiences into a world where choral artistry becomes a powerful storytelling medium.

Dr. Cathlina is currently the Director of Choral Activities at the University of Memphis, where he received the 2025 Dean's Award for Creative Achievement. He oversees the Choral Area, leads the MM/DMA Choral Conducting program, and conducts the University Singers.

A two-time GRAMMY-nominated educator, Dr. Cathlina draws deeply from his Eastern heritage. His work reflects a commitment to excellence and collaboration. In 2025, he will serve on the conducting faculty for Brazil's XV FIMUS Festival and work in the Philippines as part of ACDA's International Conductors Exchange Program. Early recognition came from the Texas Choral Directors Association (TCDA), which named him a "Young Director of Distinction."

Cathlina's teaching philosophy centers on developing masterful technicians, expressive communicators, and thoughtful citizens. Under his direction, the UofM University Singers have been invited to perform for national conferences. His students lead prominent programs—as university DCAs and symphony chorus directors. Recent/upcoming engagements include All-State and honor choirs nationwide, the International Mu Phi Convention Chorus, and a Carnegie Hall debut. Of all these, conducting honor choirs remains his most cherished creative work.

An authority on vocal pedagogy, Dr. Cathlina's research focuses on choral tone and conducting gesture. He has presented over 71 sessions worldwide. He is published in international journals. In 2025, he served as the Headliner for the Ohio and Alabama choral conferences. In 2023, he co-led Conducting Masterclasses in Greece with the University of Macedonia (Thessaloniki) and Ionian University (Corfu).

Dr. Cathlina earned a DMA in conducting with a vocal pedagogy cognate from the University of North Texas, an MM from Michigan State University, and a BME from Baylor University. Before his doctorate, he taught in Texas public schools. Beyond the podium, Dr. Cathlina is a UDRIPPIN-sponsored pickleball athlete/coach. He, his husband Kyle, and their dog Coco call Memphis, Tennessee, their home.

In concert, Cathlina wears an áo dài, traditional Vietnamese formalwear. As one of the few Vietnamese conductors in the field, he proudly dons it as a tribute to his heritage. www.franciscathlina.com

FACULTY CONDUCTOR BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Emily Frizzell, conductor and mezzo-soprano, is an Assistant Professor of Music Education at the University of Memphis and Director of the Memphis Youth Chorale. At UofM, Dr. Frizzell teaches undergraduate and graduate music education courses, supervises music residents, and directs Tigerchor Tenor/Bass Choir. Additionally, she serves as the faculty sponsor for UofM [blu] a cappella and the UofM student chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. Dr. Frizzell is an active presenter, adjudicator, clinician and researcher, with writings published in PLOS One and GIA Publications.

Before her time at UofM, Dr. Frizzell worked as Director of Choirs at White Station Middle School for seven years. Before White Station, she was the Assistant Director of Choirs at Southaven High School and Southaven Middle School. She served as WTVMEA Junior High Choral Festival Co-Chair from 2013-2016. She also served as the Memphis City Schools Teacher Field Test Group and Development Team member, which developed the pilot portfolio evaluation method for Tennessee music teachers in 2012. Dr. Frizzell was also a Peer Evaluator of this portfolio evaluation method and a curriculum writer for Shelby County Schools. In 2013, she was awarded the Outstanding Young Music Educator award by the Tennessee Music Education Association. Her choir, the WSMS Chorale, was selected to perform at the 2013 NAfME conference in Nashville, TN and the 2014 TMEA conference in Memphis, TN. Additionally, she served on the Tennessee Department of Education Music Standards Writing Team in 2016.

Dr. Frizzell is an active member of the West Tennessee Vocal Music Educators Association, the National Association for Music Education, the American Choral Directors Association, the Society for Music Teacher Education, and the A Cappella Education Association. She earned a Ph.D. in Music Education from the University of Memphis and a Master's in Music Education and a Bachelor's in Music Education from the University of Southern Mississippi. She lives in Lakeland, Tennessee, with her husband, JD, their children, Henry and Elliott, Estlin, and their dog, Ari.

Graduate Choral Conducting Studio

April Mendiola is a Mexican-American soprano and music educator from Southern California. Prior to moving to Memphis, she was a public school educator for nine years. teaching choral music at the high school and elementary school levels. She has received high regard for her contributions to public school choral program building and development. April earned a Master of Music in Vocal Performance from California State University, Long Beach, and a Bachelor of Arts in Choral Music Education from California State University, Fullerton. She also earned a K-12 Single-Subject Teaching Credential in Music from CSU Fullerton. An active soprano and choral artist, she performed in Southern California venues including the Pantages and Greek Theaters, Hollywood Bowl, and Walt Disney Concert Hall. She has performed as a chorus member with artists and composers including Andrea Bocelli, Andy Williams, M83, John Williams, A.R. Rahman, and Eric Whitacre. April is pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting with a Cognate in Vocal Pedagogy at the University of Memphis. She currently serves as the Assistant Director of Music Ministry at St. Louis Catholic Church in Memphis, TN. She lives in Memphis with her two wonderful rescue dogs, Carl and Stella Maris.

Originally from Mobile, AL, Joseph Powell is a conductor and tenor from Memphis, TN. He holds a bachelor's degree in music education and a master's degree in Choral Conducting from The University of Southern Mississippi. Currently, he is pursuing his DMA in Choral Conducting with a Vocal Pedagogy cognate from the University of Memphis and serves as conductor of Mazi, the artistic director of Memphis ChoralArts and interim director of the Memphis Symphony Chorus.. From 2014 to 2024, he was Director of Choirs at White Station High School in Memphis, TN. Powell is a 2022 recipient of the Country Music Association's "Music Teachers of Excellence" award, and has twice been a nominee for Memphis-Shelby County Schools Teacher of the Year. In addition to his teaching career, Powell is an active performer, appearing with Opera Memphis and the Memphis Symphony Chorus. Powell is also the handbell choir director and a staff singer at Calvary Episcopal Church in Memphis.

Terry Walker is pursuing a DMA in Choral Conducting at the University of Memphis. He earned a bachelor's degree in music education and master's degree in Choral Conducting, both from the University of Southern Mississippi. He serves as the conductor of the University of Memphis Collegiate Choir, Additionally, he conducted Mazi and has been the assistant conductor of the University Singers. He served as the Director of Choral Activities at Long Beach High School in Long Beach, MS, and assistant director at Warren Central High School in Vicksburg, MS. Career accomplishments include an acclaimed tour of Italy, State Convention performances in MS and LA, Masterwork performances, and over 150 performance invitations across the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Mr. Walker attended master classes by renowned artists such as the New York Voices, Mack Wilberg, Jerry Blackstone, Andre Thomas, and Arvo Pärt. He served as Chancel Choir Director at Highland Heights Presbyterian Church in Cordova, TN from 2023-2025. An active member of ACDA and NAfMe. Mr. Walker served as MSMEA District VIII chair, Mr. Walker has also served as Male Voices Repertoire and Resources and is currently Past-President of the Mississippi chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. He lives in Southaven, MS with his wife Angelique, and their children, Terry III, and Adelaide.

CHORAL AREA COLLABORATIVE PIANISTS BIOGRAPHIES

Amy Nguyen currently serves as the collaborative artist for the University of Memphis Choral Arts Department. She regularly performs with students, faculty, and guest artists at the University of Memphis. She works throughout the Mid-South, performing at area high schools, colleges, and churches. Nguyen has performed throughout the country, including performances with the Independence Symphony, the Kansas City Symphony, and the Memphis Symphony Orchestra. She has played for the West TN Youth Chorus and the Collegiate School of Memphis.

Nguyen started her piano studies at the age of five. She earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree with Honors from Graceland University where she studied with Charles Schmidt. Under the tutelage of Richard Smith, she earned a Master of Music Degree from Central Missouri State University. She also studied with Betty Mallard at the University of Texas at Austin.

Grace Gasperich is a collaborative pianist who recently moved to Memphis from South Dakota. After graduating with her master's, she decided to seek adventure and opportunity in the south. Over the past decade, Grace has had the privilege to perform with ensembles as well as in over twenty musical productions. Diego Parra, a native of Dallas Texas, began playing the piano at the age of 8. He continued private piano study for four years and then studied at Booker T.
