George Crumb is one of the most frequently performed composers in today's musical world. He was the winner of Grammy and Pulitzer Prizes. His music often juxtaposes contrasting musical styles, ranging from music of the western art-music tradition, to hymns and folk music, to non-Western musics. Many of Crumb's works include programmatic, symbolic, mystical and theatrical elements, which are often reflected in his beautiful and meticulously notated scores.

A shy, yet warmly eloquent personality, Crumb retired from his teaching position at the University of Pennsylvania after more than 30 years of service. Honored by numerous institutions with honorary Doctorates, and the recipient of dozens of awards and prizes, Crumb made his home in Pennsylvania, in the same house where he and his wife of more than 60 years raised their three children.

George Crumb's music is published by C.F. Peters and an ongoing series of "Complete Crumb" recordings is being issued on Bridge Records.

Hailing from the Midwest, **Traci Petersen** cultivated an appreciation for making and studying Art from an early age. Her mother and both of her maternal grandparents were involved in the arts and architecture.

In college, Ms. Petersen worked for the state historical archives and the film theater at the University of Nebraska's Sheldon Memorial Art Gallery, itself an architectural masterpiece by Philip Johnson, and home to 19th- and 20th-century American Art. In addition she studied Literature, Art and Architecture History in Salamanca, Spain, for a year abroad as part of her undergraduate program.

During graduate studies in Fine Art at the University of Houston was the first time Ms. Petersen entered the classroom as an instructor in Fundamentals of Design and a teaching assistant in Art History.

After earning her MFA, Ms. Petersen continued to teach in the Miami-Dade County Public Schools, at The Art and Culture Center of Hollywood, FL, and at Broward College. Since 2017, Ms. Petersen has been teaching Visual Art and AP Art History at White Station High School in Memphis.
