

MEET THE CAST



Shannon Jongema (Julia)

With her warm, expressive voice, dynamic stage presence, and conscientious attention to each musical detail, soprano Shannon Jongema is a mesmerizing storyteller on opera and concert stages alike. Shannon has recently been seen on stage as Mimì in La bohème at the University of Memphis; Mme. Silberklang in Der Schauspieldirektor, Suor Dolcina and Suor Osmina in Suor Angelica, and soprano soloist in Mozart's Requiem with Varna International Music Academy; soprano soloist in Elijah with Rhodes MasterSingers; as well as Lucy in The Telephone and Mrs.

Gobineau in The Medium with Musical Traditions, Inc. Shannon is currently pursuing her Master of Music and Doctorate of Musical Arts degrees in Vocal Performance at the University of Memphis, studying under Professor Mary Wilson. She also holds a Bachelor of Arts in Music from Rollins College where she studied under Dr. Caitlin Mohr and Professor Amy Gifford.



Philip Andrew Himebook (A Stranger)

Philip Andrew Himebook is a DMA student at the University of Memphis. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from Toccoa Falls College and a Master of Music in vocal performance from the University of Memphis. He has performed in multiple shows and operas in the Memphis area, and serves as the full-time music director at Grace Community Church in Cordova, TN.



Katrina Cole (Hannchen)

Katrina Cole (Hannchen) is excited to make her University of Memphis Opera debut this fall. This past summer, Ms. Cole participated in the Hawaii Performing Arts Festival where she performed the role of Second Spirit in *Die Zauberflöte*. Ms. Cole is a recent graduate of Penn State University where she studied vocal performance with Dr. Rachel Copeland. While at Penn State, she performed the roles of Berta (formerly Bartolo) in *Le nozze di Figaro* and Blanche de la Force (cover with performance) in *Dialogues of the Carmelites*. Ms. Cole is delighted to continue her studies at the University of Memphis pursuing her master's degree with Dr. Paulina Villarreal.



Dennis Ryan (Josef Kuhbrot)

Dennis is a native of Florida and received his Bachelor of Arts from Florida International University in 2015, a Master of Music in opera performance from the University of Kansas in 2018, an Artist Diploma from the Hartt School of Music in 2020, and is currently a Doctorate of Musical Arts Graduate Assistant at the University of Memphis. Recent engagements include, Sarastro with Lyric Opera Studio Weimar, Commendatore with the Vienna Opera Festival, Commendatore with Theater Rudolstadt, Colline with Opera Connecticut, Dr. Grenvil with Opera Naples. He has performed the Jailer in *Tosca* with Florida Grand Opera, and had solo engagements with the Master Chorale of South Florida and the Symphony of the Americas. Mr. Ryan is singing Josef Kuhbrot this November in the University of Memphis' production of Edward Künneke's, *Der Vetter aus Dingsda*. Dennis will sing Leporello in Mozart's Don Giovanni with the University of Memphis in April 2024.



Ina Torres O'Ryan (Wimpel)

Ina Torres O'Ryan, a Maryland native, is a freelance mezzosoprano and cellist currently studying at the University of Memphis with Prof. Mary Wilson and Dr. Kimberly Patterson. Before moving to Tennessee, Ina lived in Minnesota, where she was a rostered cellist and chorus member of the Fargo-Moorhead Symphony and Opera while completing her bachelor's at Concordia College. She has performed in ensembles for conductors such as René Clausen, Edward Maclary, William Skoog, Kevin Sütterlin, and Marin Alsop. A passionate educator, Ina also maintains a private studio for voice and cello and has taught for several nonprofits in the Memphis area. She serves as Executive Director of Sinfonietta Memphis, an orchestra providing free music to the 901 area using historically informed performance practice. Ina's next role will be Zerlina in the University of Memphis's production of *Don Giovanni* in Spring 2024.



Kevin Neace (Egon Wildenhagen)

The child of singers, Kevin Neace, tenor, is originally from Alton, IL, and is well-versed in performance and production of multiple musical genres. Kevin completed his Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance at Wheaton College in 2022 and is currently pursuing a Master of Music degree in Vocal Performance at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music at the University of Memphis under the tutelage of Dr. Paulina Villareal. He will be performing the role of Don Ottavio in the upcoming April 2024 University of Memphis production of W. A. Mozart's *Don Giovanni* and has previously performed in the University of Memphis productions of *Trouble in Tahiti* and *La bohème*

Jonathan Rhoades (Hans)

Jonathan Rhoades is a first-year master's student in vocal performance studying with Professor Matt Burns. Future roles with the University of Memphis Opera Studio include Mr. Gobineau in Menotti's *The Mediu*m and Masetto in Mozart's *Don Giovanni*. He previously taught 6th-8th grade choir, music appreciation, and theater in Snyder, Texas. He graduated with a Bachelor of Music Education from Oklahoma State University in 2020, where he studied with Professor Steve Sanders. He participated in OSU Opera for three years, performing the roles Dater #11 and the Bartender in Michael Ching's *Speed Dating Tonight* and Brack Weaver in Kurt Weill's *Down in the Valley*. In June 2019, he participated in the Taos Opera Institute under the direction of Mary Jane Johnson.

Jonathan Rhoades hopes to pursue a Doctor of Musical Arts upon graduating from the University of Memphis to teach at the university level and perform at the highest level.

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS



Stephen Karr, Music Director and Conductor

Born in Greenville, South Carolina, Stephen Karr is a compelling interpreter of opera and orchestral works. He is in his season as Opera Music Director at the University of Memphis Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music, where last season he led productions of a double-bill of Leonard Bernstein's *Trouble in Tahit*i and Georges Bizet's *Dr. Miracle*, as well as the inaugural fully-staged opera in the university's new Scheidt Family Performing Arts Center, Giacomo Puccini's *La bohème*. He also made his debut in May with Opera

Memphis and the Memphis Symphony Orchestra, conducting the season-closing production of *The Falling and the Rising* with music by Zach Redler and libretto by Jerre Dye. This year, he conducts the mid-south premiere of Eduard Künneke's *The Cousin from Nowher*e and W. A. Mozart's *Don Giovanni*.

In recent seasons, he has appeared with Anchorage Opera, the Sacramento Philharmonic and Opera, and the Parnassus Chamber Orchestra. As Associate Conductor and Artistic Administrator for Long Beach Opera, he was cover conductor and prompter for 2019's world premiere production of *The Central Park Five* by Anthony Davis and Richard Wesley, which went on to win the 2020 Pulitzer Prize in Music. He is a co-editor for the first critical performing edition of Joseph Bologne's *L'Amant Anonyme*, which, after its premiere at LA Opera in 2020, has seen many productions around the US and in Europe.

In 2011, he co-founded the Pacific Opera Project and was the music director until 2016. With POP, he led productions of *Trouble in Tahiti, Così fan tutte, The Turn of the Screw, La Calisto* (LA premiere), Ariadne auf Naxos and The Rake's Progress (LA professional premiere), among many other titles. The Los Angeles Times praised his performance of the Stravinsky as having kept orchestra, cast and chorus on a "well-articulated rhythmic track." He has also been on staff with the OPERA Iowa tour, the Glimmerglass Festival, Opera New Jersey and Palm Beach Opera.

Stephen Karr has taught at Chapman University, Michigan State University, USC and UCLA. His schooling includes degrees in organ performance (Mercer University and Westminster Choir College) and orchestral conducting (UCLA). He is a resident of Memphis, Tennessee.

Ben Smith, Stage Director and Producer

Ben has directed for Opera Memphis, Indianapolis Opera, Seattle Opera's Young Artist Program, Intermountain Opera Bozeman, Mobile Opera, Tacoma Opera, Asheville Lyric Opera, Opera Theatre of Pittsburgh, the Young Artist Program at Pittsburgh Opera, the University of Cincinnati/CCM, Baldwin Wallace University and The Opera Theater of Lucca, Italy.

In 2013 Ben was appointed Artistic Director of the Accademia Vocale Lorenzo Malfatti, a summer training program for young singers in Lucca, Italy.

Ben joined the faculty at Baldwin Wallace University in 2010 as their first full-time Director of Opera. Since 2015, he has been the Opera Stage Director at the University of Memphis. He has taught master classes for singing actors in the U.S. and China.

He began his career in opera as a singer, performing twenty-one leading roles in opera, operetta and musical theater. He has logged over 250 performances in the U.S. and Italy.
