

MEET THE CAST



Darius Taylor (Don Giovanni)

Darius Taylor is a baritone based in west Tennessee. Darius was most recently seen as Stranger 2 (Roderich) in the University of Memphis's Fall 2023 production of *Der Vetter aus Dingsda*. Some of Darius's favorite roles include Henry Davis (*Street Scene*), Marco (*Gianni Schicchi*), and Alcindoro (*La bohème*). Darius received his Master's in opera performance from Arizona State University and his Bachelor's in vocal performance from the University of Tennessee at Martin. Darius is working towards his Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University of Memphis and is a student of Matt Burns.



Carlos Romero (Leporello)

Mexican-American baritone Carlos Romero has been praised for his exceptional performance abilities in both the operatic and musical theater traditions. A graduate of the University of Memphis, Carlos has taken on various roles ranging from Schaunard in Puccini's La bohème, Pirate King in Gilbert & Sullivan's Pirates of Penzance, Guglielmo in Mozart's Così fan tutte, and Figaro in Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro. Concert credits include Elijah in Mendelssohn's Elijah and Judas in J.S. Bach's St. Matthew Passion with the Shreveport Symphony and scenes from Menotti's Amahl and the Night Visitors with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra. Carlos was named the NATS Southern Region winner and recipient of Spotlight on Opera's full scholarship two years in a row. Most recently, Carlos was a finalist in Opera Memphis's inaugural "Nuevas Canciones" vocal competition.



Isabella Wallace (Donna Anna, Friday cast)

Isabella Wallace, soprano, is currently studying for her Master of Music in Vocal Performance at the University of Memphis, building upon her Bachelor of Music in vocal performance from Georgia Southern University. Some of her most recent roles include Mrs. Lovett (Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street), Mabel (The Pirates of Penzance), and the Blue Fairy (La Bella Dormente nel Bosco). Isabella will return to southern Germany this summer to participate in the International Performing Arts Institute. She looks forward to the opportunity to explore and further her musical growth. Isabella thanks her family and her boyfriend for their never-ending support of her musical career.



Diana Flores (Donna Anna, Sunday cast)

Diana Flores is a Mexican-Puerto Rican soprano based in Florida. Most recently, she performed Erste Dame from *Die Zauberflöte*, Lady Caroline in world-premiere operetta *Mondo Novo*, Suor Dolcina in *Suor Angelica* and covered the roles of Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni* and *Suor Genovieffa* in Suor Angelica at the Vienna Summer Music Festival. At the Florida Gulf Coast University's Bower School of Music and Opera Naples, she performed as María in *El Cóndor Pasa*, First Lady in *The Magic Flute*, The Dew Fairy in *Hansel and Gretel*, Miss Silverpeal in *The Impresario*, and Fiordiligi in *Così fan tutte* as part of a scenes program. In 2023, she toured with the FGCU Chamber Choir as a soloist for the American Celebration of Music in Spain and France at La Sagrada Familia and Collégiale Notre Dame des Anges. She is a first-year graduate student pursuing her Master's in vocal performance at the University of Memphis.



Kevin Neace (Don Ottavio, Friday cast)

The child of singers, Kevin Neace, tenor, is originally from Alton, IL, and is well-versed in performing and producing multiple musical genres. Kevin completed his Bachelor of Music in vocal performance at Wheaton College in 2022 and is pursuing a Master of Music degree in vocal performance at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music at the University of Memphis under the tutelage of Dr. Paulina Villareal. He has previously performed in the University of Memphis productions of *The Cousin From Nowhere*, *Trouble In Tahiti* and *La bohème*, ensembles such as Bach Society of St. Louis and Rhodes Mastersingers. He will perform in the chorus of Union Avenue Opera's upcoming production of *Aïda*.



Philip Himebook (Don Ottavio, Sunday cast)

Philip Andrew Himebook is a DMA student at the University of Memphis. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from Toccoa Falls College and a Master of Music in vocal performance from the University of Memphis. He has performed in multiple shows and operas in the Memphis area and serves as the full-time music director at Grace Community Church in Cordova, TN.



Meghan Burroughs (Donna Elvira, Friday cast)Meghan Burroughs is a mezzo-soprano based in Memphis,

Tennessee. She is pursuing a Master of Music in vocal performance. She has performed widely, specializing in operatic performance, oratorio, and art song.

Meghan performed her master's recital this April. She performed Symphony No. 2, "Voices" by James Stephenson, with the University of Memphis Wind Ensemble in February 2024. In the past, Meghan has been featured in roles such as Veronique from Le docteur miracle, Mary from The Nefarious, Immoral, but Highly Profitable Acts of Mr. Burke and Mr. Hare, and Coordinator from Speed Dating Tonight! Burroughs has been awarded third place in the Schubert Club, Bruce P. Carlson Scholarship Competition 2024, and selected as a finalist in competitions such as the Beethoven Club Savell Competition.

Burroughs holds two degrees from Lawrence University; a Bachelor of Music in vocal performance and a Bachelor of Arts in psychology. She studies under Paulina Villarreal.



Haena Jeong (Donna Elvira, Sunday cast)

Haena Jeong is a mezzo-soprano from Seoul, South Korea. Jeong's previous performances include the role of Madame Flora in the opera *The Medium* at the University of Memphis, Donna Elvira in Kenneth Merrill's production of *Don Giovanni* and the Witch in *Hansel and Gretel* with Manhattan School of Music's Opera Theater in 2015.

Jeong won the 2024 concerto soloist competition at the University of Memphis. She received the inaugural Ruth William Memorial Scholarship at Songfest in 2015, where she worked with Martin Katz, Margo Garrett and Jake Heggie.

She graduated from the Manhattan School of Music with a Master's of Music under the tutelage of Ruth Golden and Maitland Peters and from Dongduk Women's University with a Bachelor's of Music. Ms. Jeong is pursuing a Doctorate of Musical Arts at the University of Memphis with Dr. Paulina Villarreal.



Ina Torres O-Ryan (Zerlina, Friday cast)

Ina Torres O'Ryan, a Maryland native, is a freelance mezzo-soprano and cellist currently studying at the University of Memphis with Prof. Mary Wilson and Dr. Kimberly Patterson. Before moving to Tennessee, Ina lived in Minnesota, where she was a rostered cellist and chorus member of the Fargo-Moorhead Symphony and Opera while completing her Bachelor's at Concordia College. She has performed in ensembles for conductors such as René Clausen, Edward Maclary, William Skoog, Kevin Sütterlin, and Marin Alsop. A passionate educator, Ina also maintains a private studio for voice and cello and has taught for several nonprofits in the Memphis area. She serves as Executive Director of Sinfonietta Memphis, an orchestra providing free music to the 901 area using historically informed performance practice. When Ina is not involved in music, she enjoys making ceramics and exploring local art in Memphis.



Cayce Murphy (Zerlina, Sunday cast)

Cayce Murphy, soprano, is an up-and-coming young Appalachian artist recognized for her versatility in multiple performance styles, captivating stage presence, and expressive sensibility.

This 2023/24 season, Murphy is overjoyed to bring the role of Zerlina in Mozart's *Don Giovanni* to life. She most recently performed as a soprano soloist in Brubeck's *To Hope: The Mass* with Rhodes MasterSingers Chorale. She will be in the chorus of Puccini's *La bohème* with Opera Memphis. Murphy studies under Professor Mary Wilson and is set to graduate with her Master of Music in vocal performance this upcoming May. She holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts in vocal performance and a Bachelor of Arts in music education (K-12) from Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia, where she studied with Dr. Alexander Lee. This is her second opera with the University of Memphis Opera, her first being Bizet's *Le docteur Miracle* in the fall of 2022.



Jonathan Rhoades (Masetto)

Jonathan Rhoades is an aspiring operatic performer living and studying in Memphis, Tennessee. Interested in the entire musical process, from creation to performance, he hopes to inspire a new generation of musicians and fuel a passion for classical music and vocal performance. He previously studied with Steven Sanders at Oklahoma State University as an undergraduate music education major. He is now studying with Matt Burns as he pursues a Master of Music in vocal performance at the University of Memphis. Previously performed roles include Hans in *Der Vetter aus Dingsda* by Eduard Künneke, Mr. Gobineau in *The Medium* by Gian Carlo Menotti, Brack Weaver from *Down in the Valley* by Kurt Weill, the Bartender and Dater #15 in Michael Ching's Speed Dating *Tonight!*, and Lieutenant Sam in *The Pirates of Penzance* by Gilbert and Sullivan.



Dennis Ryan III (Commendatore)

Dennis is a native of Florida and received his Bachelor of Arts from Florida International University in 2015, a Master of Music in opera performance from The University of Kansas in 2018, an Artist Diploma from the Hartt School of Music in 2020, and is currently a Doctorate of Musical Arts graduate assistant at the University of Memphis. Recent engagements include Sarastro (*Die Zauberflöte*) with Lyric Opera Studio Weimar, Commendatore with the Vienna Opera Festival, Commendatore with Theater Rudolstadt, Colline (*La bohème*) with Opera Connecticut, and Dr. Grenvil (*La Traviata*) with Opera Naples. He has performed the Jailer in Tosca with the Florida Grand Opera and had solo engagements with the Master Chorale of South Florida and the Symphony of the Americas. Ryan is singing Commendatore in the University of Memphis' production of Mozart's Don Giovanni in the spring of 2024.

ABOUT THE DIRECTORS



Stephen Karr, Music Director and Conductor

Born in Greenville, South Carolina, Stephen Karr is a compelling interpreter of opera and orchestral works. He is in his second season as opera music director at the University of Memphis Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music, where he has led productions of Leonard Bernstein's *Trouble in Tahiti*, Georges Bizet's *Dr. Miracle*, Giacomo Puccini's *La bohème* and the mid-south premiere of Eduard Künneke's *Der Vetter aus Dingsda*. He made his debut last May with Opera Memphis and the Memphis Symphony Orchestra,

conducting the season-closing production of *The Falling and the Rising* with music by Zach Redler and libretto by Jerre Dye, and has continued to work regularly with the MSO as an outreach and cover conductor. In fall 2024, he will lead the world premiere performance of Kamran Ince's oratorio *Jus Soli* at the University of Memphis.

In recent seasons, he has appeared with Anchorage Opera, the Sacramento Philharmonic and Opera, and the Parnassus Chamber Orchestra. As Associate Conductor and Artistic Administrator for Long Beach Opera, he was cover conductor and prompter for 2019's world premiere production of *The Central Park Five* by Anthony Davis and Richard Wesley, which went on to win the 2020 Pulitzer Prize in Music. He is a co-editor for the first critical performing edition of Joseph Bologne's *L'Amant Anonyme*, which, after its premiere at LA Opera in 2020, has seen many productions around the US and in Europe.

In 2011, he co-founded the Pacific Opera Project and was the music director until 2016. With POP, he led productions of *Trouble in Tahiti, Così fan tutte, The Turn of the Screw, La Calisto* (LA premiere), *Ariadne auf Naxos* and *The Rake's Progress* (LA professional premiere), among many other titles. The Los Angeles Times praised his performance of the Stravinsky as having kept orchestra, cast and chorus on a "well-articulated rhythmic track." He has also been on staff with the OPERA Iowa tour, the Glimmerglass Festival, Opera New Jersey and Palm Beach Opera.

Stephen Karr has taught at Chapman University, Michigan State University, USC and UCLA. His schooling includes degrees in organ performance (Mercer University and Westminster Choir College) and orchestral conducting (UCLA). He is a resident of Memphis, Tennessee.

Ben Smith, Stage Director and Producer

Ben has directed for Opera Memphis, Indianapolis Opera, Seattle Opera's Young Artist Program, Intermountain Opera Bozeman, Mobile Opera, Tacoma Opera, Asheville Lyric Opera, Opera Theatre of Pittsburgh, the Young Artist Program at Pittsburgh Opera, the University of Cincinnati/CCM, Baldwin Wallace University and The Opera Theater of Lucca, Italy.

Since 2013, Ben has served as Artistic Director and acting faculty for the Accademia Vocale Lorenzo Malfatti, a summer training program for young singers in Lucca, Italy.

Ben joined the faculty at Baldwin Wallace University in 2010 as their first full-time Director of Opera. Since 2015, he has been the Opera Stage Director at the University of Memphis. He has taught master classes for singing actors in the U.S. and China.

He began his career as a singer in opera, performing twenty-one leading roles in opera, operetta, and musical theater. He has logged over 250 performances in the U.S. and Italy.

Felix Jarrar is a composer/coach/pianist whose 254 works include 224 art songs, 13 operas, 2 string quartets, and a symphony. An indemand collaborative artist, Jarrar has worked with The New School, Opera Naples, the University of Memphis, Opera Ithaca, Penn Square Opera, Hogfish, and Santa Fe Opera (in collaboration with Mannes). In 2022, he debuted The Jarrar and Brea Duo with soprano Maria Brea. Jarrar's song "Sun of the Sleepless" was featured on the 2024 GRAMMY-nominated album 40@40 by Laura Strickling and Daniel Schlosberg. This summer, he is the Resident Artist Pianist/Coach and study cover conductor for Rigoletto at Opera North.
