BIOGRAPHIES

Karen Zeferino is a Brazilian conductor. As a child, she began piano lessons with her father and joined the UEM Music School Choir, actively participating in her church's music ministry. These early experiences inspired her to pursue a degree in conducting.

While studying at the State University of Maringá, she was an assistant conductor for various choirs and ensembles, including the UEM Flute and Strings Ensembles. Zeferino also participated in masterclasses in Brazil with renowned conductors such as William Coelho, Daisuke Soga, Alessandro Sangiorgi, and Abel Rocha. She conducted orchestral performances at the Londrina Music Festival in 2018 and with the Londrina Symphony Orchestra in 2019.

Karen completed her Master of Music in Choral Conducting at the University of Missouri-Columbia, where she was an assistant conductor for multiple choirs. In 2023, she was the guest conductor of the Columbia Chamber Choir with the Choral Arts Alliance of Missouri, presenting a program entirely dedicated to Brazilian repertoire.

She continued her development by attending masterclasses with distinguished conductors, including Dr. Marques L.A. Garrett, Dr. Derrick Fox, and Rick Bjella. In July 2022, she conducted the Tacoma Symphony and Tacoma Symphony Voices as part of the Cascade Conducting Masterclass.

Zeferino is pursuing her Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting at the University of Memphis, in Dr. Francis Cathlina's conducting studio. She currently serves as the Assistant Director of Music at St. Louis Catholic Church, the most prominent Catholic parish in Memphis, where she studies organ and assists with the planning and execution of liturgical music.

Kane Bradley is originally from Russellville, AR and served for six years as Director of Choral Activities at Pottsville High School, Junior High School, and Middle School. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Secondary Vocal Music Education from Arkansas Tech University as well as a Master's degree in Choral Conducting from Arkansas State University. Between his Bachelor's and Master's degrees, he taught for two years in Northeast Arkansas for the Buffalo Island Central School District, focusing on senior high and junior high choral music, as well as 7th and 8th grade general music. He has held professional memberships in ArkCDA (Arkansas Choral Directors Association), AR-ACDA (Arkansas Chapter of American Choral Directors Association). and ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers). He is currently in his third year as a graduate student at the University of Memphis under the direction of Dr. Francis Cathlina, where he will graduate in 2025 with a Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting.

Collaborative Pianist

Amy Nguyen currently serves as the collaborative artist for the University of Memphis Choral Arts Department. She regularly performs with students, faculty, and guest artists at the University of Memphis. She works throughout the Mid-South, performing at area high schools, colleges, and churches. Nguyen has performed throughout the country, including performances with the Independence Symphony, the Kansas City Symphony, and the Memphis Symphony Orchestra. She has played for the West TN Youth Chorus and the Collegiate School of Memphis.

Nguyen started her piano studies at the age of five. She earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree with Honors from Graceland University where she studied with Charles Schmidt. Under the tutelage of Richard Smith, she earned a Master of Music Degree from Central Missouri State University. She also studied with Betty Mallard at the University of Texas at Austin.
