About the Performers

Carlos Romero—Figaro

Mexican-American baritone Carlos Romero has been praised for his exceptional performance abilities in both the operatic and musical theater traditions. A recent graduate of Centenary College of Louisiana, Carlos has taken on various roles ranging from Schaunard in Puccini's La Bohème, Pirate King in Gilbert & Sullivan's Pirates of Penzance, and Guglielmo in Mozart's Così fan tutte. During his time at Centenary, Carlos was named the NATS Southern Region winner and was a recipient of Spotlight on Opera's full scholarship two years in a row.



Concert credits include: Elijah in Mendelssohn's *Elijah* and Judas in J.S. Bach's *St. Matthew Passion* with the Shreveport Symphony, and scenes from Menotti's *Amahl and the Night Visitors* with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra. Carlos is currently at the University of Memphis Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music for his MM in vocal performance.

Desiree Soto—Susanna

Desiree Soto, soprano, is a doctoral candidate at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music. Hailing from Texas. Desiree earned her Bachelor of Music degree in vocal performance from Texas Tech University. Some of her favorite roles include Pamina in *The Mini Magic Flute* (Opera Memphis). Lav Sister in Suor Angelica (Opera Memphis). Miles in The Turn of the Screw (Texas Tech Opera Theatre), Gretel in Hansel und Gretel, and Carrie in Carousel (Moonlight Musicals) and now, Susanna! Alyce Tarver Wells—Countess Almaviva

Alvce Tarver Wells is a soprano based in Memphis. where she is an instructor of musical theatre freshman and sophomores at the University of Memphis's Department of Theatre and Dance. Alyce is pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Vocal Performance at the University of Memphis, with dissertation research focused on vibrato patterns. Alyce's recent engagements include Galatea in Opera Memphis's production of Donizetti's II *Pigmalione.* Other Opera Memphis credits include First Novice in *Suor Angelica* and chorus for *Pirates* of Penzance, H. M. S. Pinafore, Madama Butterfly, La Traviata, and a company member for their improvisational Christmas special "A Victorian Holiday" at the Dixon Gallery and Gardens. She has also regularly performed for the annual 30 Days of Opera with Opera Memphis since 2018. Alyce's credits with the University of Memphis Opera productions include Donna Elvira in the productions of Mozart's Don Giovanni, Adele in Strauss II's Die Fledermaus, and Polly Peachum in Benjamin Britten's Beggar's Opera. Alyce was selected to perform as Laetitia in Menotti's The Old Maid and the Thief at the Curso Internacional de Música Vocal in Aveiro, Portugal in 2017. Alyce holds a Bachelor of Music Degree in Vocal Performance with a piano minor from Louisiana Tech University and a Master of Music in vocal pedagogy from the University of Memphis.



Sullivan Ojala-Helmbolt—Conte Almaviva

Sullivan Ojala-Helmbolt, baritone, lauded by the Minneapolis Star Tribune as "a strutting, silky toned and frighteningly entitled figure," in his performance of the villain Tarquinius in Britten's The Rape of Lucretia, is an experienced interpreter of music of the 20th century and onward. He has had the pleasure of performing some of Benjamin Britten's other baritone roles including Sid in Albert Herring and Junius in *The Rape of Lucretia*. Sullivan also appeared as the medical student at the forefront of the student resistance to the Nazis. Hans Scholl, in a black box production of the underperformed twoopera Die Weisse Rose Zimmermann. In addition to opera. Sullivan has worked in operetta and musical theater, including performances as Dr. Falke in *Die Fledermaus* by Strauss, Robin Oakapple in Gilbert & Sullivan's Ruddigore, and Russell Paxton/Ringleader in Kurt Weill's Lady in the Dark.



Brianna Reilly—Cherubino

Brianna Reilly is a mezzo-soprano based in Memphis, where she is pursuing both a Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degree in vocal performance at the University of Memphis. She has been selected as a finalist in competitions such as the Savell Voice Competition in Memphis, TN (3rd place), Music International Grand Prix U.S. Central Region (3rd place), and the National Association of Teachers of Singing Southeast Regionals (2nd place). This summer, Brianna will be a Principal Artist with Utah Vocal Arts Academy where she will be portraying the role of Dido (Dido and Aeneas). As an up-and-coming singer, Brianna's mission is to use her vibrant and energetic performances to instill her love of classical music into everyone that she can. She is a strong advocate of performing different types of works and has found much success in being a flexible and diverse singer.



Bradley Sowell—Bartolo

Bradley Sowell is a second-year doctoral student studying vocal performance at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music at the University of Memphis. He is also a member of the voice faculty at Rhodes College, where he teaches applied lessons. He has performed in a number of operas including Ruddigore, Don Giovanni, Zoom Speed Dating Tonight, Die Fledermaus, and Le nozze di Figaro as Sir Roderic, Masetto/II Commendatore, Dater #12, Dr. Blind, and Bartolo respectively. He has also been a baritone soloist for Jennifer Higdon's Ruminations and Carl Orff's Carmina Burana. Mr. Sowell received his Master of Music in vocal performance from the University of South Dakota and a Bachelor of Music Education in Choral Music Education from Georgia College.



T. J. Turner—Basilio/Don Curzio

T. J. Turner made his Broadway debut as a guest artist in Kristin Chenoweth's My Love Letter to Broadway at the Lunt-Fontanne Theatre in New York, NY. His notable musical theatre roles include Edna Turnblad in Hairspray, William Barfée in The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Enoch Snow in Carousel, and the Baker in Into the Woods. Equally at home on the operatic stage, Mr. Turner was honored as a District Competitor in the Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition Tennessee District. Recent operatic engagements include the roles of Sam in Susannah and Don Ottavio in Don Giovanni.




Shelbi Sellers—Marcellina

About the Directors

Stage Director, producer Ben Smith

Ben has directed for Opera Memphis, Indianapolis Opera, Seattle Opera's Young Artist Program, Intermountain Opera Bozeman, Mobile Opera, Tacoma Opera, Asheville Lyric Opera, Opera Theatre of Pittsburgh, the Young Artist Program at Pittsburgh Opera, the University of Cincinnati/CCM, Baldwin Wallace University and The Opera Theater of Lucca, Italy.

In 2013 Ben was appointed Artistic Director of the Accademia Vocale Lorenzo Malfatti, a summer training program for young singers in Lucca, Italy.

Ben joined the faculty at Baldwin Wallace University in 2010 as their first full time Director of Opera. Since 2015, he has been the Opera Stage Director at the University of Memphis. He has taught master classes for singing actors across the U.S. and in China.

He began his career in opera as a singer, performing twenty-one leading roles in opera, operetta and musical theater. He has logged over 250 performances in the U.S. and Italy.

Music Director, conductor Dror Baitel

Visiting Assistant Professor of Opera and Conducting Dror Baitel brings a wealth of knowledge and experience as a collaborative artist to his current position at the Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music. Baitel was born in Israel and comes to the University of Memphis by way of New York City, where he spent years honing his craft working with various Broadway, Off-Broadway and regional theater productions. Most recently, Mr. Baitel served as a music director and pianist for the opera scenes program and as a conductor for Gilbert's and Sullivan's Ruddigore. Baitel was on the original music team of Lin Manuel Miranda's *Hamilton*, as well as a pianistconductor for the hit musical Dear Evan Hansen. Additional credits include Mary Poppins (debut), Matilda, and The King and I. Baitel currently pursues his doctorate at the Juilliard School, where he is expected to graduate this coming sprina.





Co-Assistant Director Holly Thiemann

A Nashville native, Holly Thiemann is pursuing her Bachelor of Music in vocal performance with a minor in violin performance at the University of Memphis.
